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| Writing To use a wide range of mark making tools and observe the different effects they make. To draw circles and lines and use these to draw a face. To hold mark making tools in a comfortable grip and with good control. Reading To build upon their listening skills to enable them to listen to a range of stories and rhymes. To extend their vocabulary by reading a wide range of texts. To name different parts of a book. | To continue developing their knowledge of number names by counting and singing number rhymes. To recite numbers to five in the correct order. To develop careful counting skills by counting a row of objects. To develop their knowledge of 2D shapes. To arrange 2D shapes to create pictures. To develop their knowledge of height and to use the mathematical language tall and short. To compare and sort objects by size. |

| Communication and Language To continue to develop their communication and listening skills. To respond to instructions. To understand and answer simple questions. To apply their developing vocabulary in class discussions. | Expressive Arts and Design To draw and paint self portraits using circles and lines. To investigate colours and how they change when mixed together. To explore a wide range of instruments and the different sounds they can make. To identify an object by the sound it makes. |
| Understanding of the World To investigate growth and healthy eating. To use all of their senses when exploring a range of objects. To develop their knowledge of autumn and looking at changes in their environment. To learn about different celebrations and other cultures. | To develop their independence by dressing themselves. To establish relationships with their peers and participate in group play. To develop their knowledge of the rules and behavioural expectations. To identify different feelings and emotions and talk about how they feel. |
