Year 1 has had a fantastic week settling into class. They have been working hard on their mark-making skills, and they've used paint to create some wonderful artwork.














Welcome back to our therapy dogs

Outside of school, Mrs Keen is kept very active as she is a mum to two teenage children who keep her very busy. She enjoys visits to the gym and eating out with her family.


School Games Mark - Gold Winners

Weekly Attendance - 4th - 6th September



Good attendance and punctuality will have a positive impact on your child's future life chances. Expected academy attendance is 96%. We ask all parents/carer to support their child and us by agreeing to the following:

As parent/carer, I support the academy with the expectations of good attendance because I understand that good attendance is important for my child's future life chances.

I agree to:

- Bring my child to school every day on time.
- Telephone school by 9am every day that my child will be absent.
- Make dentist/doctors appointments, where possible, outside of school hours. If during school hours, after 2pm.
- Provide evidence for all medical appointments during the school day. This could be appointment text, card or letter.
- Complete a Leave of Absence form for all planned days of school such as holidays, funerals, sporting events etc (available from website and school office).

New Government Statutory Attendance and Punctuality Rules

ATTENDANCE

Attached is Middlesbrough Council's summary of the new penalty fines for term time holidays and school absence.

PUNCTUALITY

School starts at 8.35 am. If your child arrives before 9.05 am, they are marked with a L late code, and the morning session is counted in their attendance total. If your child arrives after 9.05 am, they are marked with a U late code, and the morning is counted in their absence total.

From September, we will have a new electronic sign system for children. If a child is late, parents/carers must come to the school office to sign them in. Children can not sign themselves in so children must not be left at the main gate.

As an academy, we have a legal duty to follow these new rules, so please be mindful of this when speaking to academy staff regarding these matters.

Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are changing from 19th August 2024

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices issued by DfE, the following changes will come into force for School Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.


National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period.

These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence

The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

Please note: The DfE does not consider a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation to be an exceptional circumstance.



Third Offence and Any Further Offences

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case could be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court. Prosecution can result in Criminal records and fines of up to £2,500

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court may show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

Uniform Expectations

Uniform Expectation for September 2024
As you will be preparing for September, we wanted to establish uniform expectations, including PE kits. In September, full uniform expectations will be enforced and children will be changed into academy provided uniform if they do not attend in expected uniform. If you need any support with this, please do not hesitate to contact the academy.

Uniform & Shoes:

- Red cardigan or jumper (it does not have to have the academy logo on)
- Red or White shirt, blouse or polo shirt
- Grey or black trousers/skirt/pinafore (no jogging bottoms or jeans).
- Red/grey tartan skirt or pinafore
- Plain ankle or knee-high socks or plain tights (grey, black, white or red). NO large frill socks.
- Red and white striped or checked summer dresses may be worn in the summer (between March and October). Grey or black shorts in summer for boys and girls. NO cycling shorts, cut-offs, leggings or
- long, baggy Bermuda style shorts.
- Flat, plain black shoes. I have listened to parent feedback and will be allowing black trainers in September. <u>Trainers must be all black, including any logos and laces</u>. NO heels.
- Close fitting flat black ankle boots.
- Shoes prescribed as part of a medical condition must also be black.
- If your child(ren) has their ears pierced, they must wear studs only. NO hooped earrings.

PE Kit – Years 1 to 6 (to be worn on their P.E day – day to be confirmed in September): One colour plain white/red/black t-shirt NO LOGOS PERMITTED

- Plain black shorts, joggers or leggings NO LOGOS PERMITTED Plain black fleece (in case it's cold) NO LOGOS PERMITTED
- . Football kits or other sports wear are not permitted.

IF YOU CHOOSE TO SEND YOUR CHILD IN A PE KIT WITH A LOGO ON, PLEASE UNDERSTAND THAT THEY WILL BE CHANGED INTO A PLAIN ITEM PROVIDED BY THE ACADEMY.

In Nursery and Reception, children need to come to school in their uniform and they will change into their P.E kit in school. This is to support the Early Years curriculum, as children are assessed on how they are able to 'manage themselves'. Please can their P.E kits be brought into school in a bag.
